


2020 Annual General Meeting of Members

- January 2013: Founded as a Corporation
- April 2013: Registered Charitable Status from CRA
- May 2013: Qualified Recipient of ECCC Ecological-Gifts Program
- **Mission:** Preserve & protect eco-sensitive areas around Lake Manitou and its surroundings
- Donations to date: \$2.35 million in cash + \$3.6 million in land
- Land acquired to date: 1,333 acres valued at \$5.5 million





ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2019

- Collected \$65,868 in cash donations
- Grew Stewardship Fund to \$170,000 from \$136,000
- Spearheaded the creation of the *Ivry Wildlife Crossing* (transferred option on 66 acres to NCC who purchased land)
- Formed an Environmental Protection Fund with AALM to help municipality of Ivry defend its by-laws against the APSQ lawsuit
- Applied for Private Nature Reserve status for 541 acres with Nature Conservancy of Canada (Barbara Richardson Wildlife)



2015: <u>Dobell:</u> **53 acres** in Ivry on Chemin Fyon/Chanterelles/Graham Eco-Gift: **\$133,000** (Tony Dobell)

Stikeman-McCall: 87 acres in Ivry + 1,100 ft of shoreline on Lake Manitou

+ 2,500 ft of shoreline on Horseshoe Lake + section of Laurentian Trail

Transferred by trustees with consent of Nature Conservancy of Canada

Culver Lot 34: 48 acres in Ivry on Chemin Fyon and Chanterelles

Eco-Gift: \$126,000 (David Culver)

Hanging Rock: 25 acres in St-Faustin on Chemin des Lacs with glacial erratic

Purchase: \$50,000 (Chalifoux) - \$35,000 from Echo and Gosling foundations

Stikeman: 247 acres in Ste-Agathe on Chemin Lac Azure with Atwater Lake

Eco-Gift: \$670,000 (Shirley Stikeman)


Patton: 49 acres in Ivry near Lac Brazeau at West end of Lake Manitou

Eco-Gift: \$93,000 (Estates of Mary Powell and David Culver)

Barbara Richardson: 541 acres in St-Faustin on Chemin des Lacs featuring 3 lakes

Transferred by trustees: \$780,000 (co-owned with Nature Conservancy of Canada)

Hague: 6.2 acres in Ivry/Ste-Agathe donated by Ken Hague featuring a hilltop

Remer: 80 acres in Ivry on Chemin Lac Manitou Sud with section of Laurentian Trail

Eco-Gift: \$159,000 (Aaron Remer)


Barker Lake: 23.3 acres in Ivry/St-Faustin on Barker Road and Chemin des Lacs

Purchased: \$30,000 (E. Barker) - \$25,500 from Fondation de la Faune & Echo

2020: Barker Lot 44A: 3 acres adjacent to Hanging Rock – Barker Lake

Purchased: \$5,000 (S.Barker)

TOTAL natural areas owned under protection = 1,333 ACRES

792 acres: Wholly-owned

541 acres: Co-owned 50/50 with NCC (Barbara Richardson)

508 acres in Ivry-sur-le-Lac

(4,400 ft/1.3 km on Lake Manitou + 2,500 ft/0.8 km on Horseshoe Lake)


250 acres in **Ste-Agathe-des-Monts** (9-acre Atwater Lake)

575 acres in **St-Faustin-Lac-Carre** (3 lakes + half of Barker Lake)

Founding member of *Ivry Wildlife Crossing* consortium

Transferred to and purchased by NCC







- 1- Townsend Nature Preserve: 80 acres rezoned (Ivry)
- 2- Powell Reserve: 126 acres rezoned (lvry)
- 3- Horseshoe Lake: 87 acres rezoned (Ivry)
- 4- Hanging Rock Barker Lake: 51 acres (Ivry/St-Faustin) ROW to Horseshoe
- 5- McCall Island: 17 acres rezoned as wildlife sanctuary since 1989 (Ivry)
- 6- Reserve Lac de la Loutre (Atwater Lake): 247 acres rezoned (Ste-Agathe)
- 7- Hague: 6 acres (Ivry/Ste-Agathe)
- 8- Lac Brazeau Reserve: 98 acres- servitudes/rezoned (Ivry)
- 9- Remer: 80 acres rezoning declined (Ivry)
- 10- Barbara Richardson: 541 acres (St-Faustin) Private Nature Reserve pending





BARBARA RICHARDSON WILDLIFE

Barbara Richardson Wildlife Foundation (541 acres in St-Faustin)

Chemin-des-Lacs between CTEL and crown land (3 km west of Manitou)

3 lakes, wetlands, mountain peaks, valley, wildlife, future trails

Transferred at no cost by trustees of BRWF (valued at \$780,000)

Benefits of 50/50 co-ownership with Nature Conservency of Canada:

- 1) Credibility and broadens sources of financing (grants and new donors) \$25k from Echo Foundation + \$8k from Valdurn for Stewardship Fund)
- 2) Largest land conservancy in Canada focused in our area + partners **Benefits to NCC**:
- 1) Local partner to plan acquisitions with and manage conservation lands
- 2) Create east-west wildlife corridor spanning 117 (NCC land near Brule)



















TERRAIN REMER PROPERTY (aka McDougall Tree Farm) 32 hectares/80 acres



PASSAGE FAUNIQUE IVRY/IVRY WILDLIFE CROSSING 27 hectares/66 acres (transferred to NCC)







LONG TERM GOALS


PRESERVE eco-sensitive areas around Lake Manitou (2,000 acres) Ownership or servitudes - Focus remains on Manitou watershed

PROTECT eco-system & trails (Maple Leaf/Nantel, Laurentian, local)

PERPETUAL stewardship (rezoned, Private Nature Reserve, co-own) Need to endow Stewardship Fund with \$250,000+

PROMOTE benefits of conservation to landowners & municipalities
(\$ Value of "Ecological Assets" and Return on "Natural Capital")
+ Connectivity in the region (wildlife corridors/crossings)

PARTICIPATE with others (NCC, ECL...) = More access to funding



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

STEWARDSHIP FUND

2017 Campaign Objective: \$400,000

Purpose: repay BOS (\$150,000) + build a Stewardship Fund (\$250,000)

Stewardship Fund: Cover ongoing carrying costs of lands in perpetuity

Capital to be preserved + Income to cover annual carrying costs

Campaign Donations: \$320,000 (80% of target)

Balance of Sale: \$150,000 (fully repaid in 2017)

Stewardship Fund: \$170,000 (yielding \$9,000/year in income)
